As clerk for the Oklahoma State Senate from 1927 until her retirement in 1971, Willie Elizabeth Shipley recorded some of the most colorful political events in the state's history. A native of Mangum, Okla., Miss Shipley graduated from Oklahoma College for Women thanks to a scholarship from the Daughters of the American Revolution. During her career, Miss Shipley witnessed firsthand the development of a young state through the administrations of 15 governors. In her will, Miss Shipley left a portion of her estate to the Oklahoma City Community Foundation to help what she described as "needy students... those who wanted to extend their education beyond high school and yet had a financial need. And, most importantly, she knew the Oklahoma City Community Foundation would follow her wishes.

Great Gifts

Foster-care youth who "graduate" from the system at age 18 start their adult lives with nothing more than their personal belongings.

For those who aspire to earn a degree of higher education, the lack of parental guidance compounded with financial need, may make the barriers seem too great.

By matching Miss Shipley's Great Gift with the Plaza Scholarship Fund - a fund that was assisting foster-care youth - the Oklahoma City Community Foundation created a program to help what may be the most needy of students: former foster-care youth. Through the Oklahoma Youth with Promise Scholarship Program, we work with state agencies and volunteer mentors to address the needs of former foster-care youth who want to pursue higher education. This program has proven to be successful in not only providing financial assistance but also in serving as a safety net for these students who have overcome incredible odds.

After spending 10 years in foster care, Allen C. received a Youth with Promise Scholarship to help defray expenses as he earned an undergraduate degree. Today, he has a master's of divinity degree and is employed as a full-time pastor. Married with two children, Allen says the scholarship "came at a critical time and was a tremendous opportunity for me to start my education and set the stage for my future."

For Crystal D., a student working toward a degree in nursing and who spent most of her youth in foster care, the scholarship "has helped relieve some of the financial stress of going to school. I really appreciate the help as it allows me to finish my education."

One single Great Gift made more than 20 years ago has had an enduring impact on the lives of productive adults such as Allen C. and Crystal D. and many others just like them.

Three key ingredients make this possible: Miss Shipley and her desire to help "needy students," the need of former foster-care youth and the Oklahoma City Community Foundation.
