Don and Willadean Ramsey have been giving to the Oklahoma City Community Foundation since 1979. Married for 43 years, they are the founders of the much-loved Blue & Gold Sausage Co.

In 2000, the couple established the Oklahoma FFA Foundation endowment fund at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation in order to ensure the growth and prosperity of agricultural education.

The Ramseys and their two sons, Greg and Brett, also recommend grants from an advised fund at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, supporting agricultural education programs and the Dale Rogers Training Center.

"There comes a time in someone's life when helping others becomes more important than helping yourself," says Don. "When you get to that point, you'll enjoy it so much."

Encouraging agricultural education

When Don and Willadean Ramsey met at a pig sale in the 1960s, they could have never imagined the important role that pork would play in their future. An agricultural education teacher at Jones High School, in the 1960s Don came up with the idea of processing hogs into breakfast sausage, which his FFA chapter then sold to raise funds. Soon after, the couple started the Blue & Gold Sausage Co. that today works with 900 groups that sell the company's pork and chicken products to raise money for special projects.

Born out of that same desire to help FFA members succeed and prosper, the Ramseys established the Oklahoma FFA Foundation endowment at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation in 2000 to provide scholarship programs, career development events, proficiency awards and statewide leadership development to the nearly 24,000 members of 362 chapters across the state. In addition, they started the OSU-Agricultural Education Scholarship Inc. endowment in 2000.
